BAGS TO TOTE TO THE GYM OR THE OFFICE

» **Whether you bike** for fitness or to save gas, here are six ways to make your green commute more agreeable. You'll look damn good, too.

1) Chrome Citizen

This bag envelops your back like a beanbag chair. Just tug on the take-up strap to tighten or loosen it, or click Chrome's signature seatbelt buckle to part the strap entirely. And it can all be done with one hand. chromebags.com, \$110

2) Cocotte Alfredo

This versatile crescent-shaped bag from Quebec can be flattened or lengthened by loosening the compression straps. The padded,

one-handed shoulder strap can be used on either the left or right side. cocotte-equip.com, \$141

3) Banjo Brothers Messenger

The truck tarp on the inside is the same truck tarp on the outside, giving the Banjo complete and total waterproofing. A carabiner makes parting the shoulder strap easy if you want to drop the bag quickly. It comes with a removable laptop sleeve. banjobrothers.com, \$80

4) R.E.Load Courier

Built like an F-150 pickup truck, the Courier was designed by Philadelphia bicycle messengers toughened by long Eastern winters. The rugged Cordura construction and hanging truck-tarp lining keep everything

5) Bagaboo Standard Messenger

On top of being street-proven by messengers in Budapest, the Bagaboo comes in a number of design and color choices. The company also offers extensive custom options for the bag, such as padded laptop pockets. bagaboo.hu, \$113
